
### FALL FUNDRAISING RECAP

PHP has several "regulars" who attend this meal each week. It's nothing fancy to be sure but if you're in need of a meal, come and see us on Mondays between 11:30 and 12:30. ### WEEKEND BLESSINGS

Weekend Blessings has had a great start to the new school year. PHP currently services over 600 students in 11 Hernando County Schools. These students have been identified by the Guidance Department as in need of food assistance over the weekend. This program is run with the full buy in of the Hernando County School Department. Weekend Blessings ended last year with an average number of 680 students being served by our backpacks. In case you're unaware of how it works: a student is verified as needing assistance, a letter goes home to the parents and the process begins. One of our 11 sponsor groups assigned to that particular school gets food supplies from the Kass Circle Food Pantry or Winn Dixie and fills a backpack with food for the 2 breakfasts, 2 dinners and appropriate snacks. The backpacks are delivered to the school and the Guidance Department hands them to the students privately. Students then return the backpacks to school, empty, on Monday. # SENIOR BLESSINGS

PHP's Senior Blessings program is going strong serving more than 250 seniors throughout Hernando County. Pastor Yvonne Woods and volunteers from Greater Love Outreach Ministry of Brooksville deliver supplemental groceries, provided by People Helping People, once a month. Seniors from Allen Temple AME Church, Brook Haven Apartments, Jerome Brown Community Center -Senior Enrichment Program, Magnolia Gardens Senior Apartment Homes and Vista Park Senior Living in Brooksville, along with seniors from Spring Hill's Madison Reserve and Vista Grand Apartments are very appreciative of the assistance given.

# THE HELP CENTER

PHP's HELP Center on Kass Circle is a busy place six days of the week. The center is open Monday through Friday from 9:30 am to 2:00 pm and again on Sunday from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm. During the week clients use the shower, laundry facilities, relax in climate controlled comfort, take advantage of the twice monthly free health clinics, meet with PHP staff and volunteers to find assistance, charge phones, and use the center's computers. Monday clients can receive a hot lunch served between 11:30 am and 12:30 pm. On Tuesday clients can pick up a hot lunch at 2 pm. The Sunday Blessings hot dinner is served at 4:00 pm.

Partners from the Weekend Blessings program come to the HELP Center to pick up food for the backpacks. Volunteers can often be seen in the Pantry weighing, dating, sorting and shelving food from food drives and donations. Community service groups use the HELP Center for a variety of meetings throughout the month.

# DOUG BRAINARD'S DECADE AT

Prior to PHP's existence, I attended planning sessions conducted by local clergy from diverse faiths on how to serve the hungry on the westside of Hernando County. Then in July 2009, a young organization, officially known as People Helping People in Hernando County, Inc. (PHP), served their first meal at the Senior Center where 42 servers fed only seven hungry people. In the fall of 2009, I started volunteering on Sunday as a server, but often ended up being the greeter at the door.

In 2010, the economy continued to sputter and the number of people needing a hot meal increased Personally, I was running my financial significantly. advisory practice and in May, I went on a month-long cultural exchange trip with Rotary to Brazil, so my volunteering at PHP was interrupted from time to time due to business, travel and other commitments.

Then later in 2010, the board of directors asked me to join their board and then to serve as their second president following Cecil Bradley. And it wasn't long before we decided to expand our food offerings to include weekend food for hungry kids. Originally known as Blessings in a Backpack, we started out in one school as a pilot and within a couple years we were adding more schools until we were in most elementary schools in Hernando County.

Programs expanded and it wasn't long before we had four main feeding programs that we labeled our Blessings programs: Sunday Blessings for our weekly hot meal; Weekend Blessings for our children's weekend backpack program; Senior Blessings, groceries for impoverished seniors in subsidized housing; and Neighborhood Blessings hot meal and groceries for homeless individuals and families.

In 2015, when the rent at the Senior Center was tripled, I

decided to look for a new place to lease for our Sunday Blessings program. I found an old hardware store on Kass Circle that had been vacant for over 10 years. The owner did not want to lease it to PHP but wanted to sell it. About the same time, the Spring Hill Civic Association sold the Lake House and distributed the proceeds to 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations in the county. PHP received enough money for the down-payment on the Kass Circle building. The owner offered us a favorable deal, so we purchased the building at 1396 Kass Circle. Because the commercial property had rent paying tenants, PHP had enough income to pay the mortgage.

On March 31, 2015, People Helping People closed on the property and we immediately started planning for the conversion if the old hardware into a community resource center and headquarters for PHP. Because PHP did not have the funds available to remodel, PHP took over 4 years to raise enough capital for designing, demolition, and renovation construction to complete the HELP Center project.

So now in 2020, PHP not only has the original four feeding programs, but a beautiful facility with a commercial kitchen and a paid executive director, Evan Sommerfeld, to keep everything running. feeding people with hot meals and groceries, PHP's HELP Center has laundry facilities, a shower and is aiding homeless individuals with tents, tarps, bedding, camping supplies, and toiletries until they can find housing. Many of PHP's clients are not homeless, but are on the edge, so the goal is to help them avoid homelessness by providing them with food, knowledge and access to services.

Since we opened in May 2019, the community resource center is now being used by a number of other agencies for meetings, a small clinic is open and PHP's Blessings programs are all growing.


